Throughout her career, Meghan has gained experience in architecture, publishing, and inclusive design. Meghan has been an inclusive architecture designer at the Institute for Human Centered Design (IHCD) since 2012. Her childhood experience of using a wheelchair has driven her fascination with Inclusive Design and the complex relationship between people and their environment. She has experience working on a wide variety of projects, including environmentally and socially sustainable, multi-sensory, institutional, healthcare, commercial, religious, cultural, manufacturing, laboratory, workplace, and residential projects.

At IHCD, Meghan has done consulting for Johns Hopkins University, Harvard University, Dana Farber Hospital, Google, Anthropic, and the MBTA. In addition, she has done analysis and provided recommendations to the Massachusetts State House, Boston City Hall, the Museum of Science and Industry in Chicago, North Carolina State University at Raleigh, Grinnell College, Georgia Institute of Technology, DCR parks throughout Massachusetts, and dozens of municipalities in Massachusetts.

Her research into restroom design, history, psychology and culture during architecture school has been recorded into the Congressional Record and presented in several publications, including the book "Ladies and Gents: Public Toilets and Gender." She has been published in *Dwell* magazine online as part of a design competition, taught at Suffolk University's Interior Design Department and at the Boston Architectural College, and she is a LEED Accredited Professional.
